## Vocabulary

- \*Hinduism A religion that covers a wide range of beliefs from the Indian sub-continent
- \*Hindu A follower of Hinduism.
- \*Brahman The name of the one God in Hinduism
- \*Trimurti The three male avatars of God called Braham (creator), Vishnu (Preserver) and Shiva (destroyer).
- \*Tridevi The three female avatars of God and wives of the Trimurti called Saraswati, Lakshmi and Parvati.
- \*Murtis Colourful figures and pictures of a deity.
- \*Aum A scared sound or symbol.
- \*Avatar A representation of a deity.
- \*Divine Of or like a God or a God.

## Key Disciplinary Knowledge
